This year's program sponsored 13 participants from both Falfurrias and Premont who worked for four weeks and created many large woodworking projects that were donated for public spaces and sold to private individuals to recoup material costs. Students were also taught financial literacy and spent time at CTC in Corpus Christi gaining hands-on experiences in various jobs of industry.

The students were compensated for their efforts with paid salaries. They were also awarded NCCER certifications for completing core industrial safety instruction, financial literacy certificates from Texas A&M University at Kingsville, and certificates of commendation from U.S. Senator Ted Cruz.
